This service will be pro bono, on instructions from Penelope Stewart. Mr. Robert Lee, Quantity Surveyor When asked, he said YES! to provide the details and cost and timeline estimates for the rebuild.

Behind the scenes, Tricia Castriota, Vice Principal representing ICHS, obtained original ICHS architect plan, info from stakeholders and is a communicator between the key players.

Centennial College allowed us to use their state of the art facility for inspiration and photos.

Reminiscing on my time spent at the Immaculate Conception High School with confidence I can attest that my most favoured days were spent in the Food and Nutrition Labs. Having my classes in the labs was indeed a pleas-

ure and to put the icing on the cake I had some of the most excellent and passionate teachers that were highly enthused about the subject they were teaching. Although the Food and Nutrition Labs facilitated magnificent moments, there were some occasions were these moments were impeded by complications. Such noticeable predicaments were; the limited amount of seating furniture, limited storage space for school bags, the hollow tables and cupboards, the refrigerators were either malfunctioning or had no storage space because they were filled to capacity and finally there were times when the simplest things such as culinary utensils were not even enough for a small class of twelve (12) girls. These inconveniences sometimes lengthened the students' food preparation process during their practical assignment or even examinations. Now at the tender age of ten (10) I knew that I wanted to become a Chef and with confidence I embarked the culinary journey. My cooking desire was furthermore, fueled in seventh (7th) grade when I had my first interaction with the subject Food and Nutrition. Not to mention I was consumed with joy when I saw the environment and the equipment that were made available to the students in the Food and Nutrition Labs. When I realized that chemistry was not working out for me my secret hopes of becoming a Medical Doctor went straight through the windows but my love for Food and Nutrition stood fierce and relentless. My love for the subject grew and developed as it became more formally

and extensively introduced to me by my fervid teachers Mrs. Henry, Miss. Rennicks, Mrs. Malladi and Mrs. Edwards.

Their instrumental initiatives shifted my disposition from wanting to be just an ordinary Chef to wanting to become a highly favoured top ranking International Executive Chef as opposed to the lawyer my father wanted me to be. 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
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
Ladies,

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

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
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ICHS and St. George's Alumni Helping To Grow the Next Generation of Canadian Lawyers

The Black Law Students' Association of Canada (BLSAC) held its national conference in Windsor, Ontario from February 9-12, 2017. Their theme, "Oneness in Motion: Impacting the Future" focussed on the many opportunities for young lawyers in an ever-expanding legal profession. Among the seminars featuring judges, lawyers and government officials from across Canada, one panel in particular had a unique twist - all three panellists were of Jamaican descent and had practices that spanned Canada and the United States. And of course, the ICHSAA was represented too! The panel, entitled "Crossing Borders", featured ICHS alumnae Audrea Golding, a Partner with Fragomen Worldwide, the world's largest immigration firm, along with St. George's alumnae Konata Lake, Senior Associate at Tory's LLP, one of Bay Street's preeminent firms, and Joseph Vernon, Principal at Miller Canfield in Detroit, Michigan and son of St. George's College Old Boys Association Robbie Vernon. The three gave the law students an insight into the paths available to become licensed in multiple jurisdictions and how to network to successfully build practices and client relationships across borders, while giving much credit to the Jamaican family and institutions that helped them along the way.





The only scholarship awarded was the inaugural G. Raymond Chang Food and Nutrition Scholarship donated by Donette Chin-Loy Chang – class of '73.

For the Academic year 2015/16 we disbursed J\$358,305.00 (CAD\$3906 from the funds raised at our dance) to pay outstanding school and or exam fees for students in financial distress. I am pleased to let you know that of the 17 students helped in 2014/15 only 3 students required financial assistance again in 2015/2016.
